

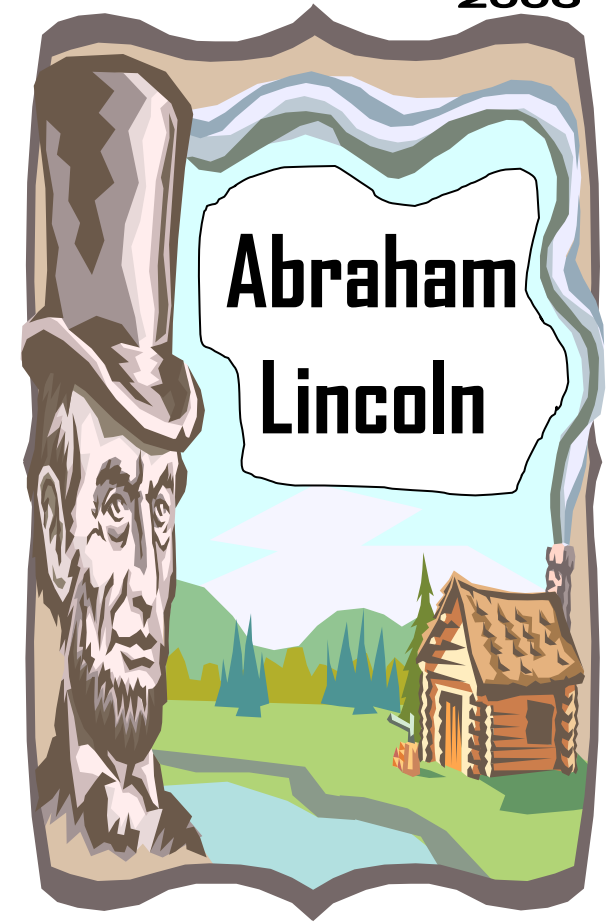
2006
