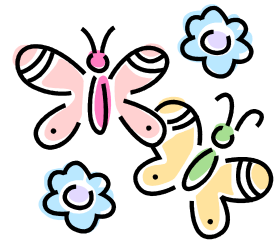

Butterfly Trivia:

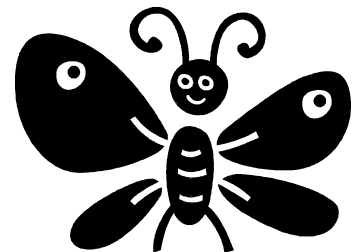


1. Ancient Greeks believed that the soul left the body after death as a butterfly.
2. Monarch butterflies can travel up to 2,000 miles from Canada and northern U.S. to California, Florida and Mexico
3. Often the male butterfly dies soon after mating.
4. Butterfly wings are covered with tiny, overlapping scales.
5. In one day, a caterpillar may eat many times its weight in food.
6. Butterflies hibernate or migrate to warmer areas because they do not live actively in cold weather.

Make An Origami Butterfly:

You will need:

- Construction paper
- Scissors
- Markers or crayons
- Pipe cleaner



Step 1: Make a square piece of paper by folding corner of a piece of paper over and cutting off the small rectangle. The square is the folded triangle.

Step 2: Fold the triangle in half.

Step 3: Open up the fold you just made. Put the triangle on the table with the central fold pointing upwards. Fold one corner over.

Step 4: Open it up again. Fold the other corner over.

Step 5: Open it up. You now have a butterfly shape. Decorate.
