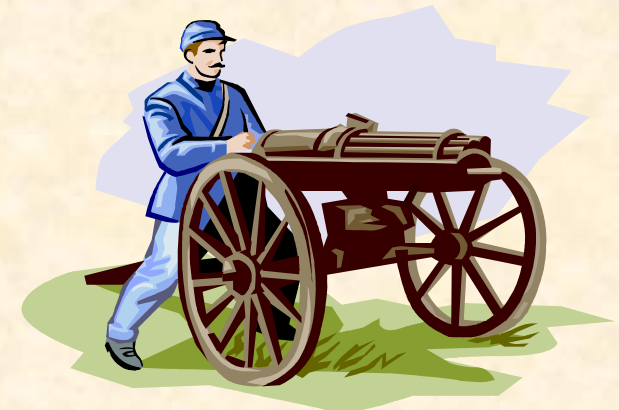

Just after the Lewis and Clark expedition, Jean-Baptiste Charbonneau, son of Sacajewea, begins his own journey.

The Day the Falls Stood Still/ by Cathy Marie Buchanan FIC BUCHANAN

Bess Heath, a young woman born into wealth but now suddenly poor, comes of age in upstate New York during the World War 1 years.

Four Freedoms/ by John Crowley FIC CROWLEY

While WWII rages abroad, a Midwest airplane factory is started in Oklahoma, attracting a motley crew of ragtag individuals to the once desolate landscape.

Homer & Langly/ by E.L. Doctorow FIC DOCTOROW

Two factual historical characters, the Collyer brothers of Fifth Avenue Manhattan, are depicted in this vivid portrait of post-World War I America.

Blood's A Rover/ James Ellroy FIC ELLROY

This is the final volume in Ellroy's "Underworld USA" trilogy. It follows three main characters through the tumultuous 1960's decade, interacting with various important figures and events from the era.

The Love Children/ by Marilyn French FIC FRENCH

Amid the turbulent 1960's backdrop in Cambridge Massachusetts, young Jess Leighton tries to make sense of the world around her, experimenting with drugs, sex, and commune life.

Sunnyside/ by Glen David Gold FIC GOLD

One winter's day in 1916, legendary actor Charlie Chaplin is suddenly (supernaturally) seen all over the world by thousands of people. This amazing illusion carries a twist of fate for the lives of two World War I soldiers and Chaplin himself.

To Try Men's Souls/ by Newt Gingrich FIC GINGRICH

With acute historical detail, former Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich depicts the American Revolution through the eyes of George Washington and Thomas Paine in this Revolutionary War tale.

A Separate Country/ by Robert Hicks FIC HICKS

With the Civil War over, former Confederate General John Hood plans to settle in New Orleans with his wife, Anna. But personal demons beset the once indomitable Hood as he tries to adapt to private life.

Seen The Glory: A Novel of the Battle of Gettysburg/ by John Hough, Jr. FIC HOUGH

Two brothers from Massachusetts, Luke and Thomas Chandler, enlist in the Union Army and partake in the epic Battle of Gettysburg.

Long Night in Twisted River/ by John Irving FIC IRVING

In 1954, when a 12-year-old boy from a small New Hampshire logging town accidentally kills the local constable's daughter, the boy and his father instantly become fugitives.

Gloryland/ by Shelton Johnson FIC JOHNSON

On Emancipation Day 1863, Elijah Yancy is born to a family of part-black/part-Indian sharecroppers in South Carolina. Soon disillusioned with life on his family's meager farm, he journeys west where he joins the U.S. Cavalry and, largely against his conscience, participates in the Frontier Wars against the Indians

Stardust/ by Joseph Canon FIC KANON

In 1945 just after the War, Ben Collier arrives home to Los Angeles to find that his brother has been murdered under mysterious circumstances.

The Lacuna/ by Barbara Kingsolver FIC KINGSOLVER

Harrison Shephard, born of an American father and Mexican mother migrates back and forth between Mexico and the US during the mid-twentieth century, meeting up with the likes of Frida Kahlo and Leon Trotsky in Mexico and a young Richard Nixon in America

A Widow's War/ by Mary Mackey FIC MACKKEY
Alone and pregnant in 1853, young Carrie Vinton is deceived into believing that her husband is dead by her wicked brother-in-law Deacon Presgrove. Now she must outwit Deacon in order to rejoin her husband now fighting for the abolitionist cause.

The Sounds of Building Coffins/ by Louis Maistros FIC MAISTROS

New Orleans, 1891: Black preacher Typhus Morningstar attends a dying child whose illness is actually demonic possession. Now Typhus must confront not only death and illness, but a Voodoo curse.

Jarrettsville: A Novel/ by Cornelia Nixon FIC NIXON

On an afternoon in May of 1869 in Jarrettsville, MD., young mother Martha Cairnes shoots her lover, Nicholas McComas, with a pistol on main street. The ensuing story backtracks through the torrid love affair and implications of relational discord dating back 5 years earlier during the Civil War.

Water Ghosts/ by Shawna Yang Ryan FIC RYAN

In Locke, California in 1916, only two establishments offer diversions for Chinese immigrant workers—a brothel and a casino run by Richard Fong. But when Richard's estranged wife suddenly arrives, things suddenly become dramatically intriguing in the tiny town.

The Help/ by Katherine Stockett FIC STOCKETT

With aspirations of becoming a writer, young Eugenia Phelan arrives home from college in 1962 to her family's Mississippi estate house. Spurred on by the advice to "write about what disturbs you", Eugenia begins to pen down her reflections of the various black women servants serving the wealthier white populations.

Fireflies in December/ by Jennifer Erin Valent FIC VALENT

In 1932, when young Jessica Lassiter convinces her parents to take in a recently orphaned black girl, the locals in her small Virginia town don't take too kindly to it.

Mrs. Somebody Somebody/ by Tracie Winn FIC WINN

Residents of Lowell, Massachusetts in 1950 are happy living in their thriving mill town. But as the decades go by, the prosperity of the town slowly erodes and the townspeople's outlook grows dim.
