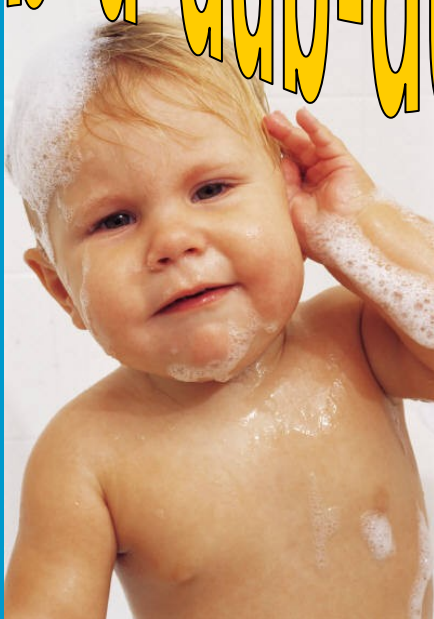

Some Bath Time Activities:

* You can turn bath time into learning time with a game of "will it float" with various objects. Let your child hold the object and ask if it will float. They can also "rescue" those objects that sink.

* As you bathe your child, reinforce the names of the body parts. "First we wash our left arm, then we wash our right arm..." You can also turn this into the "Bath Time Pokey" with "First we wash our left arm in, then we wash our left arm out..."

* You can have a special doll or toy that your child can "wash" while you are washing them. You can even discuss the different steps of making sure they are both all clean.

* Make some funny looking shapes with your toddlers hair when you wash it, then show a mirror so he/she can see how funny they look.
