Some "Getting Dressed" Activities:

* Discuss different types of clothes, such as bathing suits, coats, raincoats, etc, and what times you wear those specific items. You can also make some little flash cards, lay them on the floor, and have your child match them up (for example: rain cloud and raincoat, shorts and a sunny day). You can also make a little paper doll and paper clothes and ask, "what would he/she wear if it were..."

* Play a game with your toddler by putting on your clothes wrong, such as a sock on your hand, shorts on your head, etc, and then ask your toddler where the item really belongs.

*Discuss your child's clothes with the for alike colors, patterns, length...to help them with making choices on what they wear. This can start giving them a little more freedom in choosing their own outfits (blue shirt & blue pants...)
